

The Jewish festival of Chanukah happens in the month of Kislev (Judaism operates a lunar calendar) and this year this occurs for eight days from 8 December. The religious ceremony centres on the Menorah where a candle is lit on the first night, two candles on the second night and so on.... blessings are said and the Menorah is placed in an outward facing window to publicise the miracles it represents. It is fairly common for there to be an exchange of gifts, but the food consumed tends to be that fried in oil, again because one of the miracles commemorated involves oil.
